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ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This qualification requires applicants to have completed at a minimum:

Completion of: CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability)

OR

Completion of: CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability)

OR

Completion of: CHC30408 Certificate III in Disability PLUS the CHCSS00125 Entry to Certificate IV in Disability Support Skill Set

ABOUT THIS QUALIFICATION

This qualification reflects the role of individuals in a range of community settings and peoples' homes, who provide support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing.

Workers promote a person-centred approach, work according to, and may contribute to an individualised plan, and work without direct supervision.

They may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

OUR PROGRAM

COURSE DELIVERY





This program is available: Online (learn@home) and Recognised Prior Learning (RPL). Different criteria apply for each of these delivery modes, so speak with one of our Course advisors for more information. Our facilities include a simulated work environment which prepares you with real world situations within the workplace.

You will have up to 12 months to complete this qualification. As you currently work in the sector, there is a good chance your current role will meet some or all of the requirements of the mandatory 120 hours for this course.

CAREER OUTCOMES

SENIOR SUPPORT WORKER A role of a Senior Support Worker can be varied and exciting. You may be responsible for leading the staff and managing clients for a particular function in disability care.

SERVICE FACILITATOR As a Service Facilitator you may be required to conduct in-home face-to-face home support assessments with clients on a daily basis, using standardised assessment processes. You will work together with clients to develop individualised support plans to achieve wellness and healthy ageing goals, as well as matching and referring clients to appropriate support services.

HOUSE LEADER Working as a house leader gives you responsibility for a small team within Supported Independent Living accommodation.

AREAS OF EMPLOYMENT

PRIVATE SECTOR DISABILITY SERVICES

Working within a registered NDIS organisation to provide individualised and personalised supports to participants.

PUBLIC SECTOR DISABILITY SERVICES

You will work within a government department providing supports to participants with often high and complex needs.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Providing recovery-oriented support to clients including in relation to social supports, links to mental health treatment, housing and employment services and a quality lifestyle in the community.

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

FURTHER LEARNING PATHWAYS

This qualification may be a good introductory qualification for people looking to move into further training, such as:

- Diploma of Leadership in Disability Services
- Diploma of Community Services
