ABOUT THIS QUALIFICATION

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We recommend that you:

- have completed a minimum of an AQF level III certificate.
- are over the age of 18 before enrolling, as the placement and employment outcomes are limited for students under 18 years.
- Are currently employed in the community services sector

This qualification reflects the role of community services workers involved in the delivery, management and coordination of person-centred services to individuals, groups, and communities.

At this level, workers have specialised skills in community services and work autonomously within their scope of practice under broad directions from senior management.

Workers support people to make change in their lives to improve personal and social wellbeing and may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers. They may also undertake case management and program coordination.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 100 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency.

OUR PROGRAM

COURSE DELIVERY



This program is available: Online and Recognised Prior Learning (RPL).

Our online program is delivered over 18 months, where you will have regular check-ins with your trainer to discuss the topic and assessment requirements. A high level of self-directed learning is required by students.

You will be required to demonstrate the practical assessment requirements in your workplace, via video or physical evidence.

CAREER OUTCOMES

SUPPORT COORDINATOR

A Support Coordinator in the NDIS assists participants in developing and managing their plans, connecting with services, and adjusting support as needs change. They play a key role in monitoring service effectiveness, resolving crises, and empowering participants to make decisions, enhancing their independence and quality of life.

COMMUNITY SERVICES MANAGER

A Community Services Manager in oversees service delivery, ensures compliance with standards, leads teams, engages with participants for plan development, liaises with stakeholders, and manages budgets.

AREAS OF EMPLOYMENT

GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

Working in local, state, or federal government departments that focus on disability services and policy implementation.

NON-PROFIT ORGANISATIONS

Engaging with charities and NGOs that provide support and advocacy for people with disabilities.

PRIVATE DISABILITY SERVICES

Roles in private companies that specialize in disability services, or in firms as part of their diversity and inclusion initiatives.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

Provide training and assessment services to those wishing to enter the sector.

CONSULTANCY AND ADVISORY ROLES

Providing expert advice and consultancy services in the field of disability services management.

COURSE FEES

FUNDED PROGRAMS

Career Boost funding is available in QLD from July 1st 2025 (subject to eligibility)

Eligible Students must meet the following criteria:

- i. Aged 15 years or older;
- ii. Not be a school student;
- iii. Be a permanent Queensland resident;
- iv. Be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- v. Not already have a Certificate IV or higher qualification (including tertiary qualification) completed within the last 10 years (qualifications started as a school student, and foundation skills qualifications, do not count).
- vi. Not be enrolled in any other qualification, whether funded or unfunded, except for foundation skills qualifications.
- vii. Student must be an existing worker in the community services and Health industry, which includes parents and unpaid carers of NDIS participants

Our co-contribution fees are:

- **\$30 concession** (\$1.50 per unit)
- **\$60 non-concession** (\$3.00 per unit)

- All course materials, tuition, work placement and support services are included in the total course cost

SELF-FUNDED PROGRAMS

Our fee for service fees for this program are:

- **\$2,500 (online)**
- **\$2,200 (RPL)**
